2011 MISSOULA HISTORIC PRESERVATION AWARDS OPEN FOR NOMINATIONS

Could “Your Old House” be a very special place? Have you or your neighbor transformed a wretch of a building into a livable wonder? It’s that time of year again, time to honor those who work to preserve and restore the places in our community that lend so much character to our life in Missoula. The Missoula Historic Preservation Commission is seeking nominations for the 2011 Missoula Historic Preservation Awards, due by March 1 at 5 p.m.

“This is an opportunity to say thanks,” said Mike Monsos, chairman of the Commission. “Thanks to those responsible for restoring an old house, for designing an addition that is compatible with the historic character of the neighborhood, for doing painting projects that emphasize the historic architectural elements of a home, or for contributing to community preservation as an individual or group. Such recognition has been shown to help inspire new projects that continue to make Missoula a *Preserve America* community.”

The 20th Annual Missoula Historic Preservation Awards are judged by the Missoula Historic Preservation Commission, with the individuals and groups honored at a public catered awards event during May, which is National Historic Preservation Month. Projects must have been **completed** in 2008, 2009 or 2010.
