## EAGLE SCOUT SPEARHEADS COMPLETION OF EDUCATIONAL KIOSK IN UPPER RATTLESNAKE

As an enhancement to the Rattlesnake bicycle and pedestrian trail system, an educational kiosk has been erected in Missoula's Power Park. Located on the east side of Rattlesnake Creek 30 feet from the Duncan bike and pedestrian bridge, the kiosk provides information about the history and science of the Rattlesnake watershed, as well as displaying a detailed trail map of the area. The kiosk was erected under a power line right-of-way, and was designed to architecturally compliment the Duncan Bridge.

The information provided at the Kiosk was the work of the Montana Natural History Center, The USFS and Mountain Water Co. It is accessible to school-aged children while at the same time being relevant to Rattlesnake hikers and bikers of any age. Visitors who pause at the kiosk may learn things about Ephemeropteras and Plecopteras (Mayflys and Stoneflys), read descriptions of where the pristine water of Rattlesnake creek begins, learn about wildfires, and the Montana Power Park.

Lars Miller, a junior at Hellgate High and a member of Boy Scout Troop 1911, spearheaded and completed the kiosk project as part of his Eagle Scout requirements. "I started this about two years ago after I talked with Dr. Phil Gardner," said Miller, "I learned a lot about leadership skills, construction, macroinvertebrates, and the process of getting approval and raising money for community projects." This project is Miller's last step in order to achieve his Eagle scout rank.

Miller has been in the scouting program for more than 8 years. Through scouting, he has earned 33 merit badges from First Aid to Metal Work. He has hiked over 200 miles, with trips to the Grand Canyon, Montana's Bob Marshall Wilderness, and Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico. He has spent more than 60 nights camping. He has help many leadership positions including Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader and Den Chief. He has also been very active in serving his community by volunteering at the Watson's Children Shelter, Goodfellows Annual Thanksgiving feed for the homeless, as well as giving away trees to the needy.

Dr. Phil Gardner, who has been active with the Friends of Missoula Parks in building the small diameter log frame Duncan bike and pedestrian bridge over the Rattlesnake Creek, contacted Lars to help with a community educational component of the Duncan bridge project. "When the Duncan Bridge was built," said Gardner, "We had a requirement by Fish Wildlife and Parks to build an educational component. We felt that getting local volunteers involved would be

good, and this was a perfect Eagle Scout project, which Lars has persisted with and seen to completion." The project was managed and will be maintained by the City of Missoula Parks and Recreation Department.
