Information

A status offense is an act by a youth under the age of eighteen (18) which would not be a crime if committed by an adult. These include truancy, illegal possession of alcohol by a minor, runaway, incorrigible/ungovernable (being beyond the control of the parent). Normally, the parents or guardians of the children without law enforcement intervention handle these problems. If you have come to the conclusion that you require intervention by law enforcement or Youth Court, please follow these instructions

1. Complete and sign the status report form.
2. If you are reporting a runaway child, it is your responsibility to check places your child might be. If you locate your child take him/her home.
3. If the child is located, notify the agency you filed the runaway report with that the child has returned home. Notify the Police Dept. at 523-4777 or the Sheriff's Office through 9-1-1.
4. An officer will review the report and a citation may be issued. The report and citation will be forwarded to Youth Court.
5. If a citation is issued, a Youth Court representative will contact you and your child to set up an appointment. If a citation is not issued, an officer will contact you to explain why.
6. If a youth is taken into custody by law enforcement, it is the responsibility of the parent to come to the Police or Sheriff's Department to get the child. If the parent refuses to do so, the child will be released with no charges filed.
