- The addition of a men's and women's restroom on the first floor in the police patrol area.
- The remodeling of the West end basement utility room to add a women's and a men's restroom with shower capability.

The remodeling of the Mayors work area.
Funding is: FY17 \$60,000 for Attorney/Mayors Remodel and \$203,000 for Police Restroom Remodel.
