**Description and justification of project and funding sources:**

Construction and reconstruction of the Fort Missoula Regional Park project will add a total of 93 acres of developed, active use parkland to the City's inventory plus greatly enhance 63 acre County parkland. Park Maintenance needs will require adding equipment to care for the site. Equipment must be added in a timely fashion to reflect completion and opening of the two major park construction phases. Park maintenance equipment must be added before the west (Phase 1) FMRP site is slated to be opened (Sept. 2016). Additional equipment will be needed the following fiscal year, in FY17 when the full 156 acre site is to be completed (+/-Fall 2017).

FY16 equipment already purchased includes: 72" deck mower(31,000), Aerator (\$7,701); 1/2 Ton truck (27,160). Total: \$65,861

FY 17 equipment needs for the FMRP site total \$361,700 - see priority list for details.
