**Fire Levy June Ballot Measure**

Missoula Fire Chief Gordy Hughes discussed the need to increase the number of firefighters available to respond to fires and medical emergencies.

Missoula has grown 11.5 percent since 2008 but the number of firefighters has not. The city has put a 34-mill levy on the June ballot that would raise about \$7 million a year, allowing a new fire station—Station 6—to be staffed by 20 firefighters and built where most needed, probably in the rapidly growing area near West Broadway.

**Bear-Resistant Garbage Containers**

Erin Edge, an employee of Defenders of Wildlife, has spent two decades helping Missoula residents learn to live with bears. The regulations are being phased in over three years with bear-resistant containers being required by April 30, 2024, in Grant Creek and the Rattlesnake.

**Grant Creek Community Wildfire Protection Plan**

Mike Cole, a retired wildland firefighter and a member of the Friends of Grant Creek's Wildfire Risk Task Force, discussed the Grant Creek Community Wildfire Protection Plan. The plan was prepared over several years by neighborhood volunteers with wildland and structural firefighting experience. The plan, which focuses only on the Grant Creek watershed, will be presented the Friends of Grant Creek general meeting at 7 p.m. April 23 in the Grant Creek Inn.

**Grant Creek Road Pedestrian Crossings at Expo Parkway and Stonebridge Court**

These crossings will not be required until the developer of the Grant Creek Village Apartments has received permits for 193 units.

### **General Meeting**

Although the general meeting has generally been scheduled the third week in May, this year the general meeting will be scheduled in September in deference to the Friends of Grant Creek general meeting April 23.
