Amie Thurber

- Started National Coalition Building Institute 12 years ago
- Prejudice reduction and building coalitions of people and organizations
- Respect Clubs in schools (addressing bullying)
- Training for organizations to learn how to respect differences (Police departments, law offices, schools, etc.)
- Want to do more neighborhood strengthening
- Better connection/support among neighborhood enables crime prevention, reduced domestic violence, etc.

Alderperson's report

Marilyn Marler

- 3rd St. money is available but the EIS of 3rd St. got wrapped up with Russell EIS. Some money is available for Russell. There is funding for the bridge set aside. Not sure if it is enough given increased construction costs. EIS is likely to be approved by the feds and something is going to happen by end of the year. Construction may start in 2 years.
- Forest Service Maintenance Facility may be ready to sell within 4 years. Childers and Marler are advocating for a park for F2F neighborhood.
- Sidewalks that have been done are because of the efforts of this neighborhood council—particularly Jon Salmonson. \$60K going to sidewalks and \$40K for urban forest. Looking to improve relations of Urban Forestry with neighbors to preserve trees in yards, etc.

Ed Childers

- Wind Energy Conserving System (Wind Turbines): should they be no taller than existing zoning regulations. Sound is 55 decibels.
- Bicycle Lanes 3rd St. to Broadway and 3rd to Mount need to be a priority
- Special Districts: Passed Special District which gives us \$60K for cement work and \$40K for urban forest. Many many ideas on how to spend the \$60K.
- Group Comment: We need a different sidewalk funding mechanisms such as a small portion of car registration tax to cover sidewalks.

Rule of Thumb a few years back: \$50 per foot for sidewalk and curbs

Fiero made Motion: Neighborhood Council give \$25 per meeting to the Friends House as a room use fee.

Seconded by Mickey

Community Forum Report Erin Scott

Leadership Team working on several recommendations. Increase small project funds from \$250 to \$500. CF Leadership Team will review and approve these grants. Unspent funds being able to carry over from year to year up to \$5000. Allow operating funds to be used for capital expenses, like a tree. Work with the Neighborhood Liaison to acknowledge that the funds came from your neighborhood Council.
