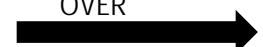

5. Heart of Missoula Parking Issues presented by Rod Austin – considerations of long vs short term parking, metered vs off street. St. Pat's and Partnership employees are seen to be the primary problem. Pros and cons of residential parking permits (like in the University district) were discussed. Alternatives like: bicycle check system, walking, shuttles, advocating for expanding public transportation to later times. These are issues that would eventually come in front of the Mayor's board and City Council if we decide to pursue.

7. The Office of Neighborhoods Report was presented by Jane Kelly.
