City Board Members and Staff Win Parks and Recreation Awards

Two Parks and Recreation Board members and Missoula Parks and Recreation's aquatics supervisor were honored last month by the Montana Recreation and Parks Association (MRPA) for their outstanding contributions to the parks and recreation field.

MRPA President Kory Thomson of Billings presented the "MRPA Citation Of Merit" to volunteer board members Dale Harris and John O'Connor and the "MRPA Professional of the Year" award to Aquatics Supervisor Eric Seagrave on September 27 during the group's annual awards banquet at the Holiday Inn.
