Summary Description and rationale of project and funding sources:

The bridge is a critical active transportation link for residents of the Northside Neighborhood to travel to downtown, schools, and other parts of the City. The project will provide for major renovation of the bridge's access towers and ramps - replacing salt damaged brick and mortar; replace failing structural deck pans and concrete ramps; replace lighting and security systems; modifying North 1st St. frontage for improved bike turning radius and safety; as well as extending bird netting full through the roof of the bridge to deter pigeons from liiving in these areas. Alternates include: polymer sealant over the new concrete ramp decks to minimize impact associated withuse of ice melt; repainting all steel; and installing a decrorative security fence to limit access around the elevator towers. Project request includes 10% covntingency and funds for restoration and/or improvement of the pocket park on N. 1st St.

History & Current Status: Impact if Cancelled or Delayed

The bridge was built in 1984 using funding from a variety of sources including a federal transportation grant, TIF, and donations. In 2010, the bridge access ramps were repaired, lighting systems upgraded, security systems added, and bird netting installed in select areas. In 2018 the City hired HDR Engineers to annually

monitor conditions of the deck pans for safety due to evidence of accelerated rusting of the structural deck pan. In the winter of 2021, the City hired HDR to design and engineer a deck pan replacement project. The following January, 2022, City staff alerted HDR of new and expanded cracks in the structural masonry wall elements of both towers. HDR inspected and advise that the bridge should be closed due to multiple structural safety concerns and that the deck pan project would need to expand to address the deteriorating condition of the masonry walls.												
Are there any site requirements/ Potentially Affected Interest (PAI) Coordination:												
Parks & Rec, Public Works and Mobility and the MPO have been working with Northside Neighborhood and residents to address alternate routes for bikers and walkers. The Departments have been supplying status updates as the revised project design has developed.
